## History Commencement Ceremony Wednesday, May 20th, 2020, 9:00am Zellerbach Auditorium

Graduation	8:30 a.m.: Doors open for Guest Seating, followed by musical interlude from 8:30—9:30 a.m.
Ceremony:	Graduating MA and PhD students assemble backstage for processional.
	Ceremony begins promptly at 9:30 a.m.
Reception:	The ceremony itself should end at around 11:30 a.m. A reception for graduates and their guests will immediately follow the ceremony in Ishi Courtyard. Refreshments will be served.
Simple Instructions:	Arrive by 9:00 at the <u>absolute</u> latest. If you wish to have a headshot taken by the photographer, you will need to arrive no later than 8:45 (note that there is no obligation to purchase the photo and you get a free proof). Find Todd in the backstage area on the left side of the stage as you enter the auditorium. There is nowhere to store personal belongings backstage, so be sure to leave any purses, umbrellas or other items with family or friends. Resist the urge to go to the right (faculty side) of the stage area, even if you are directed there by the ushers. You now look like faculty, but really still do belong on the left (student side) of the stage a bit longer. Todd will direct you to your position in line, and a map with a diagram of the stage showing how you will process. Please line up as instructed. Despite the temptation to look for family and friends, don't veer from the procession line.
The Processional:	You will then "process" from the backstage into the seating area on stage when directed to do so. In order to avoid problems, please remain in the processional order and do not deviate from your assigned seat. <b>Proper placement of the doctoral hood is draped over your arm.</b> You will carry it this same way when you later walk across the stage to be hooded.
Order of Events:	The first order of the day will be the speeches. Next is the announcement of awards and prizes. After that comes your moment in the limelight the PhDs will be first up to receive their "diplomas." The Vice Chair of Graduate Studies will be announcing the names of all graduate degree participants, and either a member of the students committee, or the Department Chair will offer a handshake and do the honor of hooding you. There is a photographer positioned to capture the moment, so exhale, and try to look relaxed.
Notice of Intention to Attend:	Register online at history.berkeley.edu/commencement, between March 9 - May 1. Please be certain to use the Graduate Student Registration Form.  To get your four (4) free tickets, you must register online by Friday, April 3rd. If you miss the free ticket deadline of April 6th, you may still register to participate with the online form until May 1. Any registration after May 1 should be directed to Todd at history-gradadvisor@berkeley.edu, we will try our best, but cannot make any promises to have you participate in the ceremony. You may purchase tickets through Cal Performances, April 8 — May 20, 2020.
	In order to keep the ceremony lively and your loved ones awake, the Department Chair includes a few student stories in his speech. When registering for commencement, you will be asked to list your notable accomplishments and activities, and to provide a brief anecdote that might help the audience understand what the process of earning your degree in history has been like.

Tickets:	Tickets are required of all guests (not you). There are two ways to get tickets:
	<ol> <li>Register for the History Commencement online and get 4 FREE tickets.         Grads are entitled to 4 FREE tickets if you register online at         <u>history.berkeley.edu/commencement</u> by April 3rd.</li> </ol>
	<ol> <li>Buy tickets through Cal Performances, April 8 — May 20.         Commencement tickets may be purchased through Cal Performances in person at the Zellerbach Hall Ticket Office, by phone, and online. Tickets are \$10 each.     </li> </ol>
	We recommend that you purchase in advance to ensure that you secure the extra seats for your guests; if tickets are still available, they will be sold at the venue on Commencement Day.
	No tickets will be sold through the History department.
	Graduating students who sign up for our commencement ceremony online by the April 3rd deadline are eligible to pick up four free tickets. The distribution of complimentary tickets will be handled directly through Todd beginning April 15th.
	Since there will NOT be reserved seating, tell your adoring public to get there early for the best view. Please direct your family and invited guests to our website for more details: http://history.berkeley.edu/content/commencement
Accessibility:	The ceremony and reception are wheelchair-accessible. If you require any form of accommodation to participate fully in the commencement ceremony including special parking arrangements, please contact <a href="mailto:history-events@berkeley.edu">history-events@berkeley.edu</a> . Please request accommodations as soon as possible since some types of accommodations take several weeks to arrange. In most cases, the University can respond to requests for accommodations up to a week prior to the event.
Regalia:	Caps and gowns are optional, but 99% of participants wear the gear. Go to the Cal Student Store (it is vastly cheaper for doctoral regalia, and is the ASUC official store) to purchase your apparel. They no longer provide rental gowns, but have a low-cost doctoral package is \$130'ish and includes a black gown, hood, and doctoral tam. Please note it is biodegradable. If you are interested in purchasing a higher quality version of a cap and gown in official Berkeley Blue you may either order it from a non-campus vendor, Cap and Gowns or PhinishedGown. Cap and Gown's price depends on the number of sets ordered on one invoice, but it is generally approximately \$400'ish. Check the website capandgowns.com for details. For additional options, check www.phinishedgown.com. The ASUC and Cal Student Store will hold a "My Grad" event on Lower Sproul Plaza where you should be able to view the options. They offer discounts on their cap & gown packages when ordered at the "myGrad" event. Note: As all campus-sponsored events through March 29 with more than 150 attendees will be canceled or postponed, the myGrad grad fair that was scheduled for March 17 to 19 has been cancelled. Instead, students can purchase their graduation regalia online at herff.ly/ucberkeley and pick it up at The Official Cal Student Store at any time.
	You may order the standard biodegradable regalia through the Cal Student Store. If you wish to order the higher quality regalia you may do so any time now, but must get your order in by approximately March 22 as they are custom made and will take six to eight weeks to arrive.
	An alternative to purchasing a gown, the Berkeley EOP office runs a Graduation Gown Lending Project open to all graduate students. Interested students can apply for free gown rental by filling out their online form. For more information please visit the lending gown project.
	The application for Spring 2020 will open on Monday February 21, 2020, and close on <b>Tuesday, April 10, 2020, at 11:59 pm.</b> Applicants should receive a confirmation email within two weeks after applying about whether they have been accepted or not.

	Whichever kind of regalia you choose, your tassel goes on the left of your cap/tam. And since you presumably already have the BA, you won't be moving it during the ceremony.

Diplomas and Other Pieces of Paper:	Diplomas will be mailed to your permanent address approximately 4 months after graduation. Make sure you update CalCentral with your future address. If you need proof of graduation before then you can obtain a <b>Certificate of Completion</b> from Graduate Division (in Sproul Hall), though note it may take up to three weeks to process.
